WHAT ARE YOU SEEKING?

Three types of questions Jesus asked:

1. **FACTUAL** questions (Matthew 15:34, Luke 8:45)
2. **INTERPRETIVE** questions (Luke 10:36, Matthew 9:5)
3. **EVALUATIVE** questions
 - “What are you seeking?” **DESIRE** (John 1:38)
 - “Who do you say that I am?” **IDENTITY** (Luke 9:20)
 - “You do not want to leave too, do you?” **DECISION** (John 6:67)
 - “Why do you call me ‘Lord’ and do not do what I say?” **OBEDIENCE** (Luke 6:46)
 - “My God, my God. Why have you forsaken me?” **SURRENDER** (Matthew 27:46)
 - “Why are you weeping? Who are you looking for?” **HOPE** (John 20:15)

The next day again John was standing with two of his disciples, and he looked at Jesus as he walked by and said, “Behold, the Lamb of God!” The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following and said to them, “What are you seeking?” And they said to him, “Rabbi” (which means Teacher), “where are you staying?” He said to them, “Come and you will see.”

John 1:35-39 (ESV)

JESUS’ QUESTION INVITES ME TO:

- Identify the **DESIRE**s of my heart.
 - Look at your **TIME, MONEY, THOUGHTS, CONVERSATIONS.**
- Seek those desires in **JESUS** and his **WAYS.**
 - Remember what you are **SEEKING** is actually **SEEKING** after you.
- Accept Jesus' invitation to **COME** and **SEE.**
 - Know Jesus doesn't give **EXPLANATIONS**; he gives **INVITATIONS.**
